

“Santa Fe Graffiti”

I have traveled to Santa Fe, New Mexico, numerous times over the years. While there, I enjoy walking around the Railyard District, where the numerous colors of the murals are proudly displayed.

Santa Fe Graffiti is a collage of the colors and designs of some of the murals and street art I have observed.

The piece features a small map of the state of New Mexico, which has been overlaid with the red sun symbol of the Zia people that is featured on the New Mexico state flag. It also features a wheat paste print of Comanche Chief Quanah Parker, which has been attributed to artist Dylan Egon. I saw one of these prints on a traffic control box in Santa Fe, and later learned they have been posted in many states.

Although street art comes and goes, this piece can be a forever reminder of things discovered.
